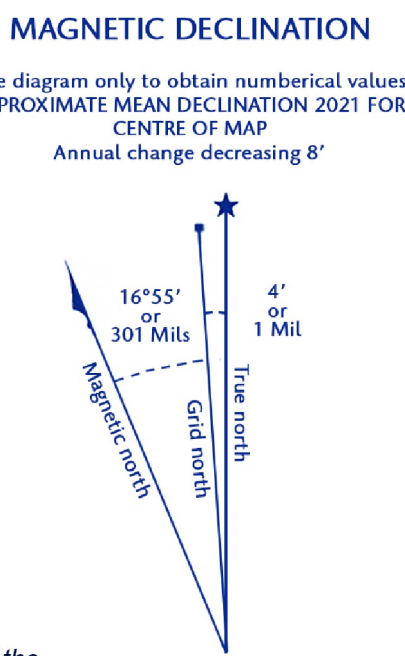

The Waverley Lakes are best enjoyed as a multi-day trip, but are also suitable for day trips. This 41 km route includes 26 portages, totalling 10560 metres.

The Three Mile Lake Warden's Cabin is a well loved cultural site. Respectful use of the cabin will ensure that wilderness travelers can continue to enjoy it for many years to come.

Navigating on open water can be hazardous when windy. Use caution and be prepared to wait for better conditions. If travelling on ice, ensure conditions are safe wherever you go.

Campsites are available on a first come-first serve basis. "No trace" camping must be practiced. Please pack out all litter. Dispose human waste in your own latrine hole well away from a campsite or water source. Please respect private property, including any private camps or structures.

Some portage trails are unmaintained, can be difficult to find and follow, and are not always marked. Be prepared to navigate through dense brush and fallen trees.

Wilderness areas are designated under the Wilderness Areas Protection Act and are managed by Nova Scotia Environment, with support from the Department of Lands and Forestry and partners like Canoe-Kayak Nova Scotia. Cellular coverage is limited. Plan ahead and leave a detailed itinerary with a trusted person.

If you choose to light a campfire, use an existing fire ring or bring your own fire pan. Make sure no fire ban is in effect. Firewood may only be collected from fallen, dead wood. Never leave your campfire unattended and thoroughly extinguish it when you do.

Anglers must follow rules outlined in the Nova Scotia Anglers' Handbook, published by the Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture. Catch and release fishing is encouraged within the wilderness area.

Please tread lightly. Check Nova Scotia Environment's Keep it Wild brochure for standards and Leave no Trace principles. Unauthorized vehicle use is not permitted in wilderness areas. If you see or suspect illegal activity, please call the province's toll-free reporting line: 1-800-565-2224
