
MURPHY'S COVE





Ramp near the Government Wharf

This launch site is at the head of Carter's Cove (though the community is called Murphy's Cove). From here, you can paddle to the cluster of small islands off Owen Point. For detailed route information, see "Eastern Shore, Murphy's Cove" in Scott Cunningham's excellent book **Sea Kayaking in Nova Scotia** (revised 2013).

Launch Site Rating Easy

Launch site Description Small gravel ramp next to metal slipway.

Amenities at site None. Do not block ramp. Park on road side.

Arriving by land

Look for a sign saying Rosborough Boats just west of an Anglican Church. Turn down this road and look for the ramp beside a sign that says Carter's Point Marine Slip.

Arriving by sea Look for the government wharf and boats. The ramp is beside the metal slipway.

MUSHABOOM



This sheltered launch site is close to an island group about two km away. A day trip is possible from here over to Taylors Head beach. For detailed route information, see "Eastern Shore, Mushaboom Harbour" in Scott Cunningham's excellent book Sea Kayaking in Nova Scotia (revised 2013).

Launch Site Description Short grass/gravel track. 6 m carry.

Amenities at site None. Limited shoulder parking.

Arriving by land This is a bit tricky to find by land and sea. Turn down the road to Mushaboom. Turn right onto Bluegrass Road and go about 700 m. Look for a break in the trees at the bottom of the hill on the left about 100 m before the bridge.

Arriving by sea Paddle behind Malagash Island into Malagash Cove. The ramp is about 100 m to the east of the bridge. Look for a break in the trees.

OSTEA LAKE ROAD



This ramp is located about half way up Musquodoboit Harbour on the east side near where it begins to narrow on its way to the sea. It gives access to the wider upper harbour and the ocean channel. Be careful of currents and quickly draining waters. See Introduction.

It may be appealing to paddle among a small group of islands at the narrows or into the large lagoon at Martinique Beach via a channel at the north end of Francis Nose Island.

Note: No other public launch sites were found on this peninsula until back near Hwy 7 on the east side of the peninsula.

Launch Site Rating Easy

Launch site Description Gravel rock ramp. Back vehicle to water.

Amenities at site None. Off road parking for 2-3 cars.

Arriving by land Look for the small pull off and ramp about 4.3 km from Hwy 7.

Arriving by sea May be a bit hard to spot. To the south is a guard rail and to the north is a small dock with a wood rail.

OYSTER POND



Looking up Oyster Pond Inlet. The ramp is on the right. Note the gap in the old Trunk Road where the bridge used to be.

Oyster Pond, though not as long as Salmon River Inlet, is another intriguing inland tidal paddle.

Launch Site Rating Easy. Caution: If you head out to sea from here or in from the sea be careful of strong currents under the bridge.

Launch site Description Fine gravel ramp. Looks like it is not used much.

Amenities at site None. End of road parking for 1-2 cars.

Arriving by land Turn off Hwy 7 at the sign for the Oyster Pond Fire Hall. Go past hall turn left on the Old Trunk Road and go to the end.

Arriving by sea Go under the bridge at the head of the East Arm of Jeddore Harbour on the east side. Look for a gap ahead where the bridge was for the old road. The ramp is about 60 m to the right.

In case you want to rinse off the salt or go for a freshwater paddle, there is a public ramp close by into not-so-little Little Lake. This delightful spot has picnic tables for a waterfront lunch, benches and a small loop trail.

Turn at the Memorial Stone about 300 m east of the Fire Hall turn. Nearby freshwater ramp at Oyster Pond

SALMON RIVER BRIDGE



The Salmon River tidal inlet with its dramatic cliffs and 4 km length makes for a enticing paddle from this launch site.

Launch Site Rating Easy. Caution: If you head out to sea from here or in from the sea be careful of strong currents under the bridge.

Amenities at site None. Off road for 1-2 cars.

Arriving by land

Turn off Hwy 7 at the Jeddore Lodge.

Arriving by sea

Look for the bridge at the head of the East Arm of Jeddore harbour on the west side. Once past the bridge, the ramp is on your left.

Launch Site Description Rocky Ramp. Fine gravel below high tide

Amenities at site. None. Off road parking for 2-3 cars.

Arriving by land This is a bit hard to spot. Directly off Hwy 7 by blue Spry Harbour sign.

Arriving by sea Look for pole frame above and a small bridge to the west. Note: It is also possible to land if needed on a small beach at the head of Spry Bay next to Taylor Head Park. A short grass path leads to the road. Not suited to launching.

Amenities at site None. Limited off-road parking. Grassy area.

Arriving by land Going east on Hwy 7, the launch is just past the sign for the Moose River Gold Museum.

Arriving by sea The road and a power pole are visible here. Across the road is a brown house.

This ramp at the head of Tangier Harbour is the launch site for Coastal Adventures, the oldest kayak touring company in Nova Scotia (1981). Paddlers can launch here with the permission of the owners, Scott Cunningham and Gayle Wilson. They offer regional and local tours, instruction, rentals and accommodations.

From this site, you can paddle out to sandy coves and Crown islands. Amenities at site Parking for about six cars. Small park next to ramp has a garbage can and picnic tables.



Arriving by land Turn down Mason's

Arriving by sea Go to the head of Tangier Harbour and look for the arch at the park on the east side. The ramp is just past a small breakwater.

TAYLOR HEAD PROVINCIAL PARK



Taylor Head beach

This lovely beach and turquoise waters invite paddling out to nearby Psyche Island on the east side of this long peninsula. The only drawback for the paddler is the long carry from the parking area to the beach. It is also an exceptional place to land for a picnic and go for a wild coastal hike. A possible launch site on the west side of this long peninsula is by one of the pullovers about 3 km from Hwy 7. The shore is rocky however and it is exposed to the SW wind on this side.

You could paddle over from the beach to the island group near Mushaboom. The launch site there has a short carry (See "Mushaboom"). For detailed route information, see "Eastern Shore, Mushaboom Harbour" in Scott Cunningham's excellent book **Sea Kayaking in Nova Scotia**(revised 2013).

Launch Site Rating Easy.

Launch Site Description Long fine sand beach. 120 m carry on boardwalk. Bring a cart if you have one.

Amenities at site

Lots of Parking, Toilets, Garbage Cans, Picnic Tables, Change rooms, Interpretive Displays, Hiking Trails.

Arriving by land Turn at the sign for the park and go 5km to the end of the road.

This shallow surfy beach may require a surf launch even on a calm day. It has a short carry to the beach unlike nearby Clam Harbour Provincial Park.

Launch Site Rating Easy to difficult depending on surf.

Launch Site Description Exposed shoreline. Long sand beach. Short 10m carry

Amenities at site None. End of road parking for 1-2 cars.

Arriving by land Look for Point Road off Clam Harbour Road and go to the end.

Arriving by sea Trailers can be seen at the east end of the beach. The road is at the west end of the beach.

CLAM HARBOUR PROVINCIAL PARK



Clam Harbour Beach

This long sand beach is home to the popular annual Sand Castle competition. It is shallow and surfy like many Eastern Shore beaches and so launching is easier on a calm day. A second obstacle to launching at this beach is the long carry - about 100 m so bring a cart if you have one. Another option is to launch at Clam Bay for ocean paddling or at Little Harbour to access Clam Harbour, a large shallow bay behind the beach (mid to high tide). See launch site descriptions.

Launch Site Rating Easy to difficult depending on the surf.

Launch site Description Long sand beach, Long asphalt/wood path to beach.

Amenities at site (In park) Parking, Toilets, Garbage Cans, Wooded Picnic Area, Interpretive Display, Change Rooms, Water

Arriving by land Turn off the Clam Harbour Road onto Beach Road. Look for the blue park signs.

Arriving by sea Look for a long sand beach to the east of a drumlin headland and boardwalk steps.

EAST JEDDORE

East Jeddore is a busy fishing area with lots of wharfs and sheds and boats. However, no public ramps were found anywhere along this shore. One owner of this community



wharf gave permission for paddlers to launch he Harbour narrows before entering the sea. Ramp at Baker's Point, East Jeddore

Launch Site Rating Easy. Be aware of currents and shallow conditions at low tide. Sandy at the harbour mouth.

Launch site Description Gravel ramp.

Amenities at site None. Parking for 2-3 cars. Do not block access to wharf or ramp.

Arriving by land Turn down Lindee Lane at Baker's Point about 7 kms from Hwy 7. Turn right at the stop sign and go to the end.

Arriving by sea The ramp is beside the last wharf at Baker Point on the east side if paddling into the harbour. It is between the wharf and a short breakwater. It is also across the harbour from three brown cottages (Serenity by the Sea).

HEAD OF JEDDORE - Harbour View Drive



This ramp provides access to the extensive twin arms of Jeddore Harbour. Like other inlets to the west, the harbour narrows before reaching the sea. From here you could paddle around Myer's Point and under the bridge into the long dramatic Salmon River outlet.

Launch Site Rating Easy. Sheltered.

Launch site Description Fine gravel ramp. Back car down to water.

Amenities at site None. Roadside Parking

Arriving by land The north end of Harbour View Drive is about 2.3 km down the West Jeddore Road off Hwy 7. The ramp is about 30m from the south end which exits back onto the West Jeddore Road.

Arriving by sea May be tricky to spot. It is about 300 m NW of a small island with a white house on it.

LITTLE HARBOUR

Little Harbour is a classic Nova Scotian fishing village and active home port. From here you can paddle at mid to high tide up a narrow channel from Little Harbour into Clam Harbour. You can also paddle out to a scattering of islands 2-3 km from the entrance. Launch Site Rating Easy

Launch Site Description Sandy/eel grass shoreline. Short carry. Sheltered. Narrow harbour entrance.

Amenities None. Park out of the way.

Arriving by land At Owl's Head, turn down the road to Little Harbour.

Go 3.5 km and look for the road to the wharf.

The sandy shore is behind a building with a blue Harbour Authority sign.

Arriving by sea Look for the wharf at the entrance to the harbour. The take out is beside the wharf. Be cautious of currents at the entrance to the harbour.
